### Roof Repair

The Trustees have been active during the shutdown. The slate roof has been repaired at the cost of \$5,046.00. The contractor claims this should stop the leaks into the organ room and sanctuary. If so, this will save us the cost to repair the flat roof, which was estimated to be \$34,000.00. The Trustees will monitor the leak-prone areas this summer to make sure there is no more water intrusion. If that is the case, the organ can be completely repaired to restore its full range of sound.
